I am grateful for each of you this morning. James 1:21 instructs us to “(put) aside all filthiness and all that remains of wickedness, (and) in humility receive the word implanted, which is able to save your souls.” I also think of David’s cry to “create in me a clean heart, and renew a right spirit within me.” I want to be more like Jesus and I know you do also. Let’s pray that His power to shape Christ’s life in us as we worship Him this morning!

I want to express my gratitude to our Lord and His work through you this morning. Yes, COVID made it a difficult year but we still see God’s blessings. Seven or eight months ago, I had no idea what to expect. But today many of you have proven yourself to be very faithful, not looking to the left or the right during the challenges of this year.
